Am I engaged with my church family? Is my life honoring Jesus at home, work, and play? Am I drawing close to Jesus through Bible study and prayer? Though these questions are not comprehensive, they provide a starting point as you listen to the Holy Spirit speak truth into your life.

This 7-Day Prayer Guide will help you prepare for our Christmas Eve Communion and a wonderful celebration of Christmas. The Birth of a Savior Foretold
